Season 2022 Highlights



















This 10th Annual General Meeting of the AFL Barwon Football Commission Ltd is able to report the successful "bounce back" from the Covid-19 Pandemic that severely impacted our communities over the past two years. The hard yards that our Community Football and Netball clubs have navigated with great diligence and skill in 2020 and 2021 have been rewarded with a complete season of Football and Netball in 2022 that by any measure has been outstanding. Our army of volunteers has done a remarkable job given the challenges of the return to play protocols and the adaptation to a raft of changes to how we all work, rest and play. Our participation rate in Football and Netball at all levels has not only returned to pre-Covid levels but is demonstrating growth that exceeds the expectations of most administrators. Our Female Football competitions continue to thrive and the growth in Junior and Senior Netball numbers is most impressive. The record breaking attendances at our Finals across all formats and age groups showed the massive interest in community sport in our region and is a great credit to the leadership and enthusiasm of club administrators and volunteers.

The one area of concern is that our Clubs have reported a drop off in the return to volunteering. It is hoped that the successful completion of Football and Netball finals will remind everyone how rewarding it can be to belong to one of our Community Clubs and to participate actively in our games of Football and Netball. AFL Barwon is currently working with the AFL to provide much needed assistance to Regions, Leagues and Clubs with the intention of being able to provide training, support and other benefits to volunteers. There are significant resources being directed to this process and an ongoing funding stream that will be linked to the revenues of the game at the highest level. The revenue streams will be ongoing and as the AFL industry revenues increase the funding levels in the program will increase commensurately.

The enhanced use of technology will be part of the solution to reducing the volunteer workload. It needs to be acknowledged that the introduction of new operational systems such as PlayHQ can be seen as a burden in the initial stages of change. AFL Barwon is committed to supporting our Clubs and Leagues in adapting to the new platforms and ensuring that assistance is available to make this a positive experience. AFL Barwon has been very active in providing feedback to the platform designers who are continually reviewing the functionality of PlayHQ. The AFL is very aware that the transition to the new platform requires investment and commitment from all parties and is committed to providing the necessary support.

Another challenge in the AFL Barwon region is to be able to provide the infrastructure to match the growth in participation. The G21 & AFL Barwon Regional Strategy – Towards 2030 is an important piece of work to inform and advocate for the provision of facilities to enable the growth of our participation numbers to continue. The rapid growth in our female participation creates the urgent need for the provision of appropriate change room facilities for all participants and for the expansion of the number of playing fields and Netball courts in the region. All of this at a time when Governments at all levels are constrained by budget deficits. We must continue to advocate for the continued investment in Community Sport by Government and our Peak bodies. At the same time we will need to be prepared to maintain our own financial viability and be prepared to demonstrate our own commitment to plan and invest in our Club facilities, which includes adherence to Salary Caps and other policy measures that promote Club sustainability. We will need to remain vigilant to make sure that there is always a focus on prioritising the provision of active Communities through our local sporting clubs.

AFL Barwon is grateful for the support of our Football and Netball Umpiring bodies in our region. As with club volunteer numbers there has been a reduction in the numbers of Umpires returning to the game post Covid. There will be a focus on improved recruitment and retention of Umpires but it is not only the role of the Umpire representative bodies to grow the participation in Umpiring. There is an important role for Football and Netball clubs to play in this space to provide a safe and respectful environment for Umpires. Clubs can also be proactive in encouraging members and participants to consider becoming Umpires or being advocates for our Umpires.

The Strategic Planning process is currently underway. InsideEDGE has been commissioned to lead the workshops and provide support for the process. AFL Barwon looks forward to all stakeholders engaging with this process over the coming weeks to be a part of the future planning for Football and Netball in the region.

It is important to acknowledge the excellent work of the AFL Barwon Operations team. It was a very difficult time for many workplaces during the Covid lockdowns. AFL Barwon was no different. Whilst the JobKeeper payments allowed us to maintain our staff profile, the post lockdown period provided opportunities for some valued staff to advance their careers beyond AFL Barwon. The team members who took the opportunity to advance their careers beyond AFL Barwon did so with the best wishes and thanks of AFL Barwon. Under the leadership of Region Manager, Ed Wilson, AFL Barwon has assembled a vibrant team to take us forward and to provide our stakeholders with industry leading support. AFL Barwon is committed to providing our staff with the environment that will enable them to identify their aspirations and see them progress their careers. You will read elsewhere in this Annual Report of the work done by our team in their respective departments. I am sure you will all join in thanking them for their considerable efforts.

AFL Barwon recognises the great service provided by our three outgoing Commissioners since our last AGM. Ian McTaggart and Richard Underwood both stood aside as Commissioners as they had served three terms and under the requirements of the Constitution were required to do so. Pip Jankowski resigned from the Commission in February 2022 having served one three year term. Our Region is very fortunate to have enjoyed the committed work of these three Commissioners, all of whom have continued to offer support and advice to Football and Netball in AFL Barwon. During 2022 the Commission has been able to fill the vacant Commission positions following a recruitment campaign. The new appointees are Ashley West, Mick Overman, Diana Murase and Mark Wilken. The new Commissioners bring great skills that meet the identified needs of the Commission.

At this AGM I complete my third term as a Commissioner and I will not be standing for re-election under the terms of the Constitution. I take this opportunity to thank Commission Deputy Chair Michelle Gerdtz for her unstinting support to me and to the Commission. Michelle has served three years in this role and is a tremendous asset to the Commission and to Football and Netball in the region. I thank all other current and past Commissioners for their great work and contribution to Football and Netball since the inception of AFL Barwon.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the Leagues, Clubs and Stakeholders for their commitment to Football and Netball and I hope that we can all work co-operatively to ensure the ongoing success of our Community Football and Netball Clubs. This Region is blessed with the greatest volunteers and Club leaders in Community Sport. Long may it continue to be so.

In the under 14.5 competition, Irrewarra-Beeac who finished the season on top of the ladder with 17 wins defeated Apollo Bay to be premiers for 2022.

This year the CDFNL participated in Junior Football Interleague playing against Central Highlands Football Netball League. The selected players across the Under 13, 15 and 18 age groups represented the league extremely well and whilst the Under 15 were the only team to come out on top, the matches provided our players with a fantastic experience and opportunity to develop their skills as well as great exposure for our league. Thank you to our coaches Paul Listro, Joel Flanagan and Adam McNamara for their support in developing our junior players.

Congratulations to all League Best and Fairest winners with this year's Mahoney Medal won by Alvie's Levi Dare who edged out rising star Campbell Scott from Colac Imperials. Alvie spearhead Dominic Dare took out the Goalkicking award with 88 goals. Campbell Scott capped off a fantastic season by also being selected by the Senior coaches as the recipient of the Max Gray award for best Under 21 player.

Alex Williamson from Alvie took out the Reserves Best and Fairest in a tight count with Alistair Lugg finishing runner up. Sam Kelly was the leading Goalkicker this year with 64 goals.

Mitchell Hall from Irrewarra-Beeac was the winner of the Under 18's award and runner up being Jay-Dee Baines from Colac Imperials whilst Irrewarra-Beeac's Charlie Morrissy was the leading goal kicker with 63 goals. In the under 14.5 there were joint winners for the second year with Luke Everett from Alvie and Tamar Holt from Apollo Bay both polling 34 votes. William Larcombe from Lorne was the leading goal kicker with 107 goals.


