## NETBALL OPERATIONS & UMPIRING REPORT

The 2023 netball season started with lots of promise, all ten clubs fielded six grades and seven clubs a D grade side. The season did not disappoint, with 9 of the 10 clubs finishing the season playing finals, resulting in our best finals series to date.

Congratulations must go to all clubs on the enormous work that went into the preseason which resulted in this incredible effort. Clubs with two courts and seven teams had matches running side by side for the first time, enabling them to finish early and watch some football, which created a more cluboriented atmosphere.

Our representative sides had another successful year competing in the ten-week Barwon Junior Champions from February to May, with 17 & Under winning the competition. Six teams competed in the Association Championships at Altona in June, with both 17 & Under sides reaching the finals.

At the Association Championships our umpires Melissa Kettle and Leah Perkins officiated in finals. Leah has been invited to take part in a junior umpiring program running from October 2023 to May 2024

Three sides also represented the League in interleague against Central Highlands in Colac with great success.

Many thanks to our representative coordinator Tracey Tann and all coaches, not only for the many hours of preparation and training but also the friendship and guidance they offer the girls.

In our CDFNL season A Grade was a repeat of 2022 with old rivals Alvie and Irrewarra-Beeac playing another brilliant grand-final.

The Bombers revenged their defeat of the previous year by one goal in the final two seconds. All other premier clubs, Irrewarra Beeac: D Grade, 15 & Under and 13 & Under who were premiers and champions. Birregurra: B grade, Colac Imperials: C Grade and Western Eagles who were premiers and champions in 17 & Under.

2023 is a year to be proud of on many levels. It's the first year since 2019 that felt 'normal' and football and netball again took the focus off our weekends and there was a certain freedom about playing, watching and officiating unrestricted.

We also took major steps in setting the future direction of the region.

Our consultation process started by gathering feedback from all football and netball clubs in the region about what the key focus areas should be in the next three to five years.

Some of these focus areas remain the same such as the need to recruit and retain our football and netball umpires, upgrade facilities and help with the recruitment of volunteers, but two particular focus points resonated with the Commission; greater visibility of netball and creating a better plan for competition structures.

Netball deserves to be seen as an equal and should be elevated and celebrated on many levels. Our Clubs are now at least a fifty/fifty split of males and females and netball should be prioritised whether it's on social media or in our future planning.

It was a changing of the guard in some respects with the AFL Barwon Commission in 2023. With Craig Keating completing his final term as Chair, I proudly assumed the role and through a recruitment process in late 2022, it was a Commission made up of many new faces and new ideas.

Our mantra was about spreading the load in 2023. With that several Commission subcommittees were developed to support the AFL Barwon staff group with key operational and strategic work.

Finance, Risk and Audit, Football & Netball Operations, Stakeholder Engagement, People & Culture and Future of Football & Netball sub-committees were developed with a Commission member assuming the chair position of each. With this initiative, we also changed the structure of the AFL Barwon Commission meetings from monthly to by-monthly allowing for each subcommittee to meeting in the off month.

I thank each of the Commission in 2023 for their hard work and dedication to these new structures. In my first year as chair, I have felt the support and enjoyed sharing ideas and the robust discussions that come with that.

I would like to thank Robert Hallet who finishes with the Commission at this next AGM after a 10-year term. Thanks, Bob, for your hard work and dedication to AFL Barwon. You will be missed.

Finally, a massive thank you to our wonderful group of staff led by Edward Wilson. We are so fortunate to have a dedicated and passionate group that care so deeply about football and netball in our region.





## REGIONAL MANAGER REPORT

Immense success. Immense progression. Immense opportunity.

Every day leading AFL Barwon is an absolute privilege and to do so in a region that is immensely reach, brings great responsibility to support our Clubs, competitions, and leagues, to leave them in a better place than we found them.

For AFL Barwon in 2023, encapsulating this into everything we do was vital as we expanded our service delivery, and elevated the quality for which we led competitions and the region at large. For us, we cannot deliver these competitions and leagues, led community initiatives and drive positive outcomes for the region's 23,000 participants, if it wasn't for a dedicated cohort of volunteers and Club representatives, who even 17 months into my time with AFL Barwon, continue to amaze me with their passion and generosity.

The return of the AFL Barwon Community Awards in 2023 we hope as a small token of our appreciation for the incredible contributions many throughout our community made this year. As an organisation, we truly believe that all 51 affiliated Clubs are more than places to kick a footy, and shoot a netball, but rather are part of the fabric of their local community, and the wealth of formative developmental initiatives are testament to this.

In May 2023 following eight months of development, the AFL Barwon & Geelong Cats Strategic Partnership was launched. This partnership since its inception, has provided significant value to our community in-line with the partnership's five pillars – Community Engagement, Partnerships, Facilities & Environments, Membership & Participation, and Organisational Resourcing. The significant engagement experienced through the jointly delivered Female Festival of Sport week, the establishment of a 15-team U9 Girls Football competition (original aim of 4-6 teams in 2023)

and collective visions to driving facility development and growth across the region, has all been mutually beneficial aspects of this partnerships, in its initial months. To the Geelong FC CEO Steven Hocking, Chief of Strategy & Growth Marcus King, Head of Community Will McGregor and Community Engagement Manager Jess Dangerfield – thank you for your engagement with AFL Barwon, and we look forward to expanding our strategic partnership in 2024 to create greater club engagements, and elevate our region across a range of unique, outcome-driven opportunities.

The onboarding of the Club Development Officer and the subsequent recruitment of a full-time Club Development Lead, has presented for the first time, a full-time resource for Clubs to support their areas of opportunity and their individual ventures for growth and sustainability. The investment into this role, as well as the recent recruitment drive for a Group Manager – Operations, speaks to our belief that we need to be more than competition administrators, we need to actively support and drive greater value for our Clubs, to ensure Football & Netball continue to be the sport of choice, for so many across the Barwon region.

These changes elevate the value of our affiliations and furthermore, with Michelle Gerdtz assuming the AFL Barwon Commission Chair role in December 2022, AFL Barwon has experienced a governance evolution that drives greater decision making capacity and efficiency. The development of four sub-committees - across the streams of Finance, Operations, People & external engagement, have supported the internal team significantly and have increased the value we're able to deliver to all 51 Clubs, and our community partners. Thank you to Michelle, Deputy Chair Ashley West and the entire AFL Barwon Commission, for their continued support, engagement and expertise, which in my professional experience is second to none.

The partnership establishments, the role recruitments and governance evolutions detailed above, have all stemmed from the finalisation of AFL Barwon's new multi-year Strategic Plan. This document driven by actionable deliverables, has framed the strategic direction for the organisation, post significant consultation with all affiliated Clubs, community and government partners. AFL Barwon continues to be immensely proud of the community which we have the privilege of working a part of, who drive us for greater outcomes and in turn, supports our initiatives to capitalise on success, progress our region and support opportunities. Whether the establishment of the Colac Otway U10 & U12 15-team Football competition (original objective of 4-6 teams), the fourth season in-a-row of at capacity mid-week Netball competitions (despite playing across three venues – a first for AFL Barwon), or the change in Female Football age groups to promote greater development and support for players - these are just the start of the new Strategic Plan, delivering actionable deliverables within the region.

As aforementioned, it is a privilege to lead AFL Barwon and this privilege is elevated further by the incredible team that lead AFL Barwon every day. With a wealth of tenure, expertise and transferrable skills, their contributions and enthusiasm is admired and valued daily. We're proud to restore organisational culture, and role stability across the team, which has delivered greater outcomes for all stakeholders as a result. The internal team, in-line with the Commission, are committed to growing our delivery model to relief Club operational stress and therefore, increase the value our Clubs and competitions, provide to all community members.

## FOOTBALL REPORT

### MICHAEL LIMB

The CDFNL 2023 season commenced on the 25th of March, featuring an exciting clash between Irrewarra-Beeac and Alvie at Central Reserve.

Alvie Swans achieved a remarkable feat, ending a 23-year premiership drought by securing their thirteenth senior premiership. They accomplished this by defeating Colac Imperials in the Senior grand final with a convincing 36-point lead. In the Reserves category, Simpson emerged victorious in a closely contested match, narrowly beating Lorne by 3 points. Meanwhile, Irrewarra-Beeac displayed their prowess in the Under 18 division, clinching the premiership, prevailing over Lorne by 13 points. In the Under 14.5 competition, Irrewarra-Beeac topped the ladder with 17 wins and only 1 loss, securing back-to-back 14.5 premierships by defeating Birregurra with a commanding 35-point victory.

Congratulations are in order for all the League Best and Fairest winners, with the prestigious Mahoney Medal being awarded to Irrewarra-Beeac Bombers' Tyler Flanigan. Alvie's star player, Dominic Dare, continued his dominance by clinching the Goalkicking award for the fourth consecutive year with an impressive tally of 113 goals. The Max Gray award for the best Under 21 player went to Colac Imperials' Campbell Scott.

In the Reserves category, the Best and Fairest title resulted in a tie between Lorne's Harvey Martin and Alvie's Mitchell Williamson, while the Reserves' leading Goalkicker for the year was Christian Kelly from Birregurra, boasting an impressive 83 goals.

The dedication and hard work of these clubs do not go unnoticed by the AFL Barwon staff, who worked tirelessly to ensure the smooth running of CDFNL 2023. 

## FOOTBALL UMPIRING REPORT

### JOCK HILLGROVE

It is with great pleasure that I present our 2023 AFL Barwon Umpiring Department Annual Report for the CDFNL.

Firstly, and foremost, I would like to thank all umpire's, Club and League appointed, in the Region for their dedication, commitment and particularly those that officiated in multiple games each weekend, without these dedicated people umpiring could not have delivered the service to as many games as we were able to do.

Our aim in 2024 is to have all "Club" Appointed Umpires to be registered, appointed, and paid for their roles, building access to online umpire match day reports, replacing hard copy version's and in person and online umpire coaching access across the Region and raising more investment back into umpiring.

We know in doing so will allow us to grow the "AFL Club Umpire Engagement Program" to greater benefit umpiring in our Region and raise a greater investment into our umpire people and development resources.

AFL Barwon League Umpire numbers in Colac are down 20% since 2020 and is in urgent need of more umpires, particularly field and goal, to avoid Senior CDFNL football having to utilise club appointed umpires in 2024. This will be a key focus area for the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department for 2024, club buy in is paramount to assist in the dwindling numbers and help regrow umpiring in the CDFNL.

In the CDFNL we had 3 persons who umpired as "League" appointed each week below Senior Grades with all other junior positions filled by "Club" umpires.

In total we had 76 (Geelong 67, Colac 9) new "League" umpires who began their umpiring journey with AFL Barwon, there were a further 45 new "club" umpires registered.

AFL Barwon continues to invest in umpiring by significantly increasing the coaching, resource, and development budgets, dedicated AFL Barwon staff resources, and passing on a 5% match fee increase to all levels and disciplines of umpiring and guaranteeing a further 3% to all match fees increasing in 2024. A total of 8% increase, from 2023 – 2024 after 0% increase from 2020.

Our AFL Barwon Umpiring Coaches and match day observers, the mentors and key support staff in Geelong and Colac who once again delivered an outstanding job. I would like to personally thank you all in your approach, support, and development of the umpire groups.

The role of our coaches is very time-consuming, managing appointments, observations, assessments, and skill development training / coaching sessions up to twice per week. We will be looking to restructure how this is delivered to greater efficiency in 2024 by investing and using greater online video technology along with the further development of the Officials HQ Platform and the new Umpire Accreditation framework being released in November 2023.

I would like to thank David Anderson (Colac) retiring, Eden Stubbing (Geelong), moving into an MDO role 2024, trainers Alan Doherty and Deb Tingiri (Geelong) and Sports Conditioning Austin Tattersall (Geelong) for their dedicated service to umpiring support and coaching. Whilst they are stepping away and pursuing other opportunities and family time, we know we will see you around.

AFL Victoria asked AFL Barwon to be part of the Women & Girls Development Coach Facilitator and Education Program pilot (AFL Victoria funded), which we greatly appreciated the opportunity to participate, Julie Ford was appointed as our facilitator for 2023.

The objectives of the pilot program were:

- To become the main point of contact for female umpires within the umpire clubs
- To become a structured position within the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department
- Marketing material to be specifically distributed through club/league networks by the liaison - focusing on benefit of umpiring to players/clubs (skills, money, resourcing) and investigating potential funding sources for positions
- Deliver education sessions with coaches focusing on inclusive selection processes,
  ensuring the inclusion training module has
  been completed, creating the best possible
  environment, and recruitment strategies that
  are specific to diversity

Creating a gender inclusion networking point within Community Umpire Clubs and supporting the education of existing coaches in creating inclusive environments and implementing equitable selection policies.

Julie was able to implement a contact network engaging our female umpires specifically whilst also those of non-gender or fluid identities, attending AFL Victoria shared workshops and being a "real" conduit of umpire coach and umpire relationships.

We hope to continue this role in 2024 irrespective if adopted and funded by AFL Victoria after its pilot year.

Although too many to individually mention in this report, we would like to acknowledge all umpires who achieved major milestones from their first games to debuting in Senior Men's and Women's Football and reaching major finals adding to their development and experience. Congratulations to all those that have achieved their goals and successes to date.

As the "Club" Umpire program expands in 2024, we look to involving more clubs who have already indicated their want to be involved. It is worth noting that these "Club" Academies are not restricted to just junior players and could be aimed at older players in higher age groups including seniors.

AFL Barwon Umpiring Department thanks the CDFUA and GFUL for their ongoing support of umpires and their members, a rewarding and challenging role for your Board's, by working all together for the betterment of umpiring in the Region is and should always be the focus, thank you to Douglas Evans (CDFUA) and David Chaston (GFUL) for your leadership.

In closing I would like to thank David Harris for his time with the AFL Barwon Umpiring Department, before moving to a role with AFL Victoria, he has assisted us enormously, David has made a big impact to AFL Barwon Operating team having also managed the AFL Barwon "All Abilities" competition.

Will Ross took up the opportunity to replace David and I have thoroughly appreciated Will's drive and enthusiasm to help support and grow umpiring in 2023. Will's role will be further expanded in 2024.

To David Harris and Leigh Bulwalda (AFL Victoria), the AFL Umpiring Department, we thank you for your ongoing support to us in 2023.

Thank you to Jim Allen and your board and clubs in the CDFNL in enabling umpiring to become a greater focal point in the direction of football within your League. There's still a lot of work that needs to be done and with the help of all Clubs we can succeed together.

To all my fellow colleagues at AFL Barwon I am immensely proud of all your work in 2023, we have had many changes and challenges thrown at us in 2023, yet I strongly believe we have delivered a very successful and enjoyable year.
