FDM Report

Development

As Football Development Managers we have successfully delivered Development Programs for AFL Victoria, as well as producing critical outcomes for the AFL Barwon Region through targeted League/Club Development Programs and strategies throughout 2017.

Participation

Our continued focus of developing and supporting all pillars of the game, from NAB AFL Auskick to Open-Age football, ensured that participation across the State and Region continued to develop:

- We were able to support 3121 NAB Auskick participants, an increase of 250 participants from the previous year.
- We supported all of our 130 AFL School Ambassadors and School Competitions including primary and secondary SSV and GISSA competitions.
- We continued to promote the game of AFL to school participants through the Sporting Schools Program.
- We conducted School Holiday Programs for 127 participants, as well as a Footy Frenzy promotions.

Community

We supported all of the AFL Barwon affiliated Leagues in regard to the management, structure and best practices of all our Clubs, as well as developing environments that seek to motivate committee members, volunteers, umpires and coaches at all levels in the Barwon region:

- We worked with all of the GFNL, BFNL, GDFL, CDFNL, GFUL and CFUL Football and Netball Clubs to implement outcomes that are outlined in the recently released G21 and AFL Barwon Strategic Plan.
- We conducted Facility Audits at 82 venues across the AFL Barwon Region.
- We facilitated and organised community education presentations for AFL Barwon aligned Clubs, which included topics consisting of: Vilification and Discrimination, Cyberbullying, Respect and Responsibility, Gambling and Drug & Alcohol Awareness.
- We accredited 219 coaches through our Senior, Youth and Junior/Auskick Coaching Courses.
- The Annual Coach of the Year Dinner for 178 guests was held, recognising the outstanding work of our Coaches and Volunteers in the AFL Barwon Region.

Three coaches/coordinators were also recognised at state level. Congratulations to Dom Gleeson (Senior Coach of the Year Nominee), Ryan Mackay (WINNER of the State NAB Auskick Volunteer of the Year) and Barry Orvis (Allan Jeans Lifetime Achievement Award, rewarding contribution to coaching)

Engagement

We developed engagement initiatives, particularly within the multicultural and indigenous areas, as well as continuing to engage girls into football to grow female environments into the future:

- The Geelong Diverse Academy continued, giving approx. 70 players from diverse backgrounds the opportunity to learn the skills of AFL and develop as players and people.
- AFL Barwon and the Geelong Cats continued to strengthen its relationship with the Next Generation Academy program, and together introduced the Buddy Program for primary school aged students from diverse backgrounds.
- We established a Girls Under 15 competition, and grew the total number of female teams from 17 teams in 2016 to 44 teams this season.
- We conducted gala days with AFL Barwon clubs to promote students to transition to club football for over 1300 primary aged students.
- We ran the Geelong Cats Community Camp in the Northern Suburbs of Geelong, where we engaged with indigenous and multicultural groups.

Fans

We worked hard to develop our 'fans of the game' by working closely with the Geelong FC:

- We coordinated all of the AFL Player Appearances for Geelong FC players at approx. 90 schools, 40 junior clubs and 40 NAB Auskick centres and extra visits.
- We ran a NAB Auskick Superclinic for approx. 1,500 participants at Simonds as well as the Geelong FC Junior member's clinic for approximately 800 kids.

Talent

- We successfully managed and coordinated the V/Line Cup program for 49 Under 15 boys and 25 Under 16 girls.
- We were involved with the organization and running of the Worksafe Community Championships, Herald Sun Shield School football competitions and other representative games at club and school levels.
- In it's second year, the Colac Academy consisted of 44 boys from the Colac region who participated in the 8 session program.

The BFNC enjoyed a successful season with three football sides a netty side playing finals, culminating in a back to back senior footy flag. Membership and player numbers were strong and anticipated to be healthy in 2018. The departure of Ben Boseley has left a coaching void in the senior footy, thus far recruitment has proved fruitless. The Club will likely appoint a coach from within the Club by the end of October. The ground redevelopment will be completed by the commencement of the 2018 season, including new netty courts, lighting and change rooms/ shelter shed for the netty facility. The Club has held its AGM with the appointment of Mick Paddick as President and John Cotton as VP, Ron Elsbury will continue in the Treasurer role. The Club has estimated a player payment spend of ~\$77k in 2017. The Club is quite anxious about the new financial reporting requirements in 2018 and would welcome education and training from the league in this endeavour. The BFNC has thus far lost three senior players however will not actively recruit and otherwise promote from its junior ranks in 2018. The Club is unlikely to request extra points for the 2018 season. The BFNC is in favour of a return to three on the bench for the reserves in 2018, however a decision on the senior bench has not been established.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General Information

The financial report is a special purpose financial report, which has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The financial report is prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The financial report covers the Colac and District Football Netball League Inc. as an individual entity. The Colac and District Football Netball League Inc. is an association incorporated in Australia under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial statements.

Basis of Preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

(a) REVENUE RECOGNITION
