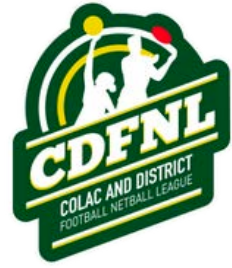

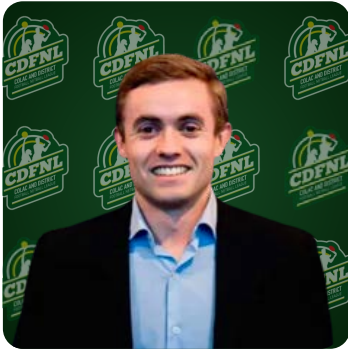
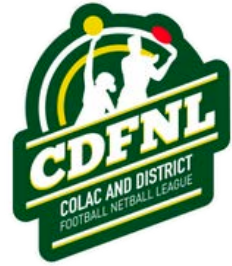
We also need to acknowledge our fantastic sponsors and their commitment to the continued success of our league. Their support not only allows us to continue financially but also putting back into the community through your support.

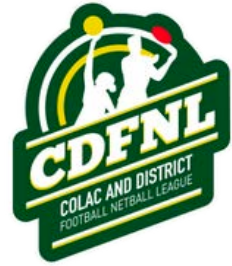

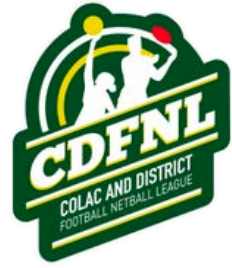
Attending games and meetings in the Colac area has been great and has given me still a taste of good local country football, something I have grown up with over the years whilst growing up in Launceston, Tasmania.

2024 saw the inaugural onboarding of a Club Development Lead as a full-time resource to support our clubs in the areas of growth opportunities and sustainability. The appointment of this position illustrated AFL Barwon's belief and commitment that as competition administrators, we need to actively support and drive greater value for our clubs.

I wish to express my gratitude to AFL Barwon for the opportunity to serve in this role during the 2024 season and beyond. I have enjoyed meeting club representatives, all working to connect with their communities and improve their clubs. I take pride in fostering collaboration among clubs by sharing ideas and best practices. Special thanks to the clubs for letting me highlight their successes!

In 2024, a key priority was supporting clubs in recruiting, retaining, and recognising volunteers through committee structuring and strategic planning. This will remain a focus to help alleviate volunteer fatigue.

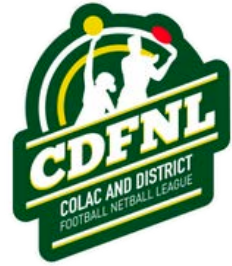
The 2024 season saw the delivery of AFL Victoria's volunteer education and compliance programs including 'The Women & Girls Inclusive Club workshops', equipping six clubs with resources for inclusive environments from a gender-neutral perspective. I was also thrilled to coordinate the inaugural AFL Barwon Child Safeguarding Education Program, alongside Sam Dellamarta, following state government legislation mandating all sporting clubs to introduce policies and procedures that help to protect children from child abuse. Thank you to the clubs that identified Child Safeguarding Officers that were part of this education program.

I assisted clubs with funding and grant opportunities from AFL Victoria, LGAs, and governments. Thirteen clubs in Barwon received Telstra Footy Club Grants for items like goalpost padding and education courses. The TAC Club Rewards Program also proved successful, with 10 clubs receiving \$39,250 in funding for promoting road safety—one club earning the maximum \$10,000 grant, matched by only one other club in the state.

I enjoyed working with local and state authorities to advocate for club infrastructure improvements on behalf of several clubs under my remit. Some 'big wins' were achieved during the 2024 season which I found very rewarding. I will continue to advocate on your behalf as the opportunities present.

A big collective thank you to all our volunteers whose commitment is admired and respected. I thank the boards of the GDFNL and CDFNL for allowing me to engage with your clubs in all things Club Development. This new role aims to bring value, and I look forward to continuing this support.

FOOTBALL REPORT FROM THE FOOTBALL COORDINATOR

The 2024 CDFNL season was a competitive year marked by Lorne's Senior premiership win, Alvie's success in the Reserves, Birregurra's premiership in the Under 18s, and South Colac's undefeated Under 14.5 season. Top individual honors went to Brad Surkitt as League Best and Fairest and Dominic Dare as leading goal-kicker. Thanks to the CDFNL Board and volunteers for their invaluable support.

The 2024 CDFNL season was an exhilarating and competitive year for local football, featuring standout performances and thrilling matchups across all divisions. The season commenced on March 23 with a high-energy opener, as Alvie showcased their strength in a commanding 73-point victory over Irrewarra-Beeac at Alvie Recreation Reserve. A heartfelt thank you goes to the CDFNL Board and all club volunteers for their dedication and support, which were crucial to the success of the 2024 season.

SENIORS

The season culminated in Lorne claiming the Senior premiership, marking their fourteenth win in this category. In a closely contested final, Lorne overcame Irrewarra-Beeac with an 18-point margin.

Alvie reinforced their competitive stature in the league by triumphing over Simpson in the Reserves Grand Final with a 37-point victory. Simpson's Cody Mason was honored as the Best & Fairest, with Irrewarra-Beeac's Darcy Trethowan as runner-up. Christian Kelly from Alvie led the Reserves' goal-kicking with an impressive 89 goals.

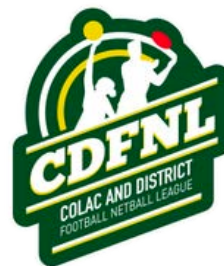
UNDER 18

Birregurra demonstrated impressive determination and skill, surging in the final quarter to secure an 8-point win against Irrewarra-Beeac. 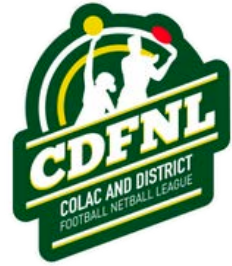

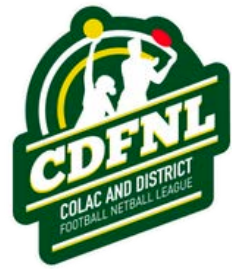

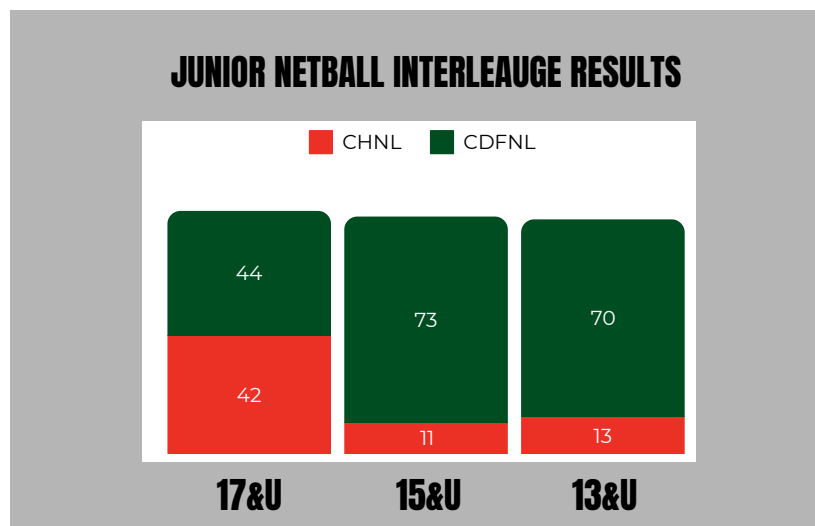
JUNIOR NETBALL REPRESENTATIVE PROGRAM REPORT



The CDFNL Representative program continued to display the high calibre netball of the region through Barwon Junior Netball Championships, Interleague, and Association Championships.

Barwon Junior Netball Championships was a 10-round competition for 13&U and 15&U teams, and 6 rounds for 17&U competition. While our teams did not reach the Grand Finals, it was a fantastic development opportunity for our players as they prepared for Association Championships and Interleague.

The CDFNL put on a dominant display in Ballarat against the Central Highlands league in June. I would like to thank the Central Highlands for hosting the day, and for their ongoing engagement in Interleague. We look forward to continuing this in future seasons.

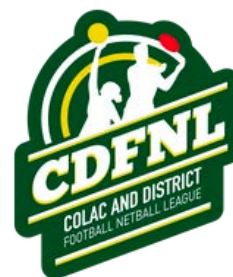

FOOTBALL UMPIRING REPORT FROM DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING

Thank you to all Umpires, Club and League appointed, in the greater Barwon Region for their dedication, commitment and particularly those that officiated in multiple games each weekend, without these dedicated people umpiring could not have delivered the service to as many games as we were able to do.

AFL Barwon seeks to have all club-aligned umpires registered in Officials HQ to enhance direct coaching and guidance. This supports the expansion of the "AFL Club Umpire Engagement Program" and strengthens umpire development across the region.

In 2024, all umpires completed mandatory AFL Umpire Courses. Addressing a 25% drop in Colac umpire numbers since 2020, particularly in field and goal umpires, remains a priority. Efforts are focused on recruitment and retention to ensure CDFNL's future success and reduce reliance on club-appointed umpires by 2025. Club support is crucial to rebuilding Colac's umpiring community.

Exploring midweek and Friday games could improve umpire availability for clubs, meeting rising junior and female football demands. Fixturing changes should offer entry-level opportunities for new field umpires in CDFNL.

For 2025, the goal is for all club-appointed umpires to be registered, appointed, compensated, and have access to digital match-day reports. Online and in-person coaching will also expand.

2024 HIGHLIGHTS:

- **Online Umpire Match Reporting and Voting:** Implemented in 2024 for senior and U18 football, with plans to extend to all leagues in 2025.
- **Umpire Coaching and Development:** AFL Barwon plans to boost coaching efficiency using video technology and enhance Officials HQ with the new FTEM Accreditation framework.
- **10% Increase in Appointments:** In 2024, umpire appointments rose 10% due to improved availability and onboarding of club-aligned umpires.
- **Women & Girls Development:** The Women & Girls Development Program, led by Julie Ford and Evie Knight, recruited four new female umpires and trained 14 more for 2025.
- **White Card Policy:** AFL Barwon's White Card policy reduced disrespectful behavior from the coaches' box, with only 27 cards issued in 2024, promoting a healthier environment for umpires.

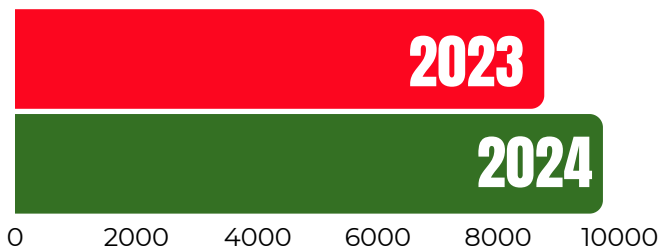

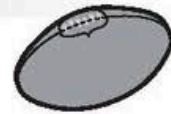


