Nomination & Selection Processes

Our process is outlined in the diagram below.



Nomination process commences

- As part of the H&ASC meeting schedule, the Awards Program is to be included as an Agenda item in the Committee's first annual Meeting of the Year. This inclusion ensures that all Committee members are familiar with the information and process (in case that there is a change of Committee members).
- Minutes of Meetings are taken by a nominated staff member, usually the Chair of the History & Awards Sub Committee.
- In June of each year the nomination forms for all Award categories are reviewed and distributed by the H&ASC members for deliberation.

Nominations assessed against criteria

- At the July scheduled meeting of the new year, the H&ASC reviews the nominations and supporting documentation to ensure that nominees meet the category criteria.
- The H&ASC Committee considers each nomination against the criteria and identifies their preferred nominee.
- Should the H&ASC not be able to narrow down to a single preferred nominee, then a short list can be developed for consideration in the next stage of the process.

H&ASC recommendations to the AFL Barwon Commission

- A report will be presented to the AFL Barwon Commission including the list of nominees and the selection criteria; plus any rationale.
- During the next AFL Barwon Commission meeting (or another meeting depending on time available), the AFL Barwon Commission will review the final recommendation (from the H&ASC), consider and endorse.
- The AFL Barwon Commission may elect not to support the H&ASC recommendation based on information that they are privy to.
- The AFL Barwon Commission's decision will be communicated via email to the H&ASC at their next scheduled meeting.

Naming & Renaming of Awards Process

The AFL Barwon region has a rich history and tradition of recognising excellence and contributions to our community through various awards. To ensure these awards reflect the outstanding individuals and their legacies, a formal process for renaming awards has been established.

The awards eligible for naming and renaming will be determined by the History & Awards Sub Committee on an annual basis.

Application Process

Submission of Application:

- Interested parties must submit a detailed application on the form
- The application should include comprehensive information about the individual proposed to be honoured with the renaming of an award.
- Specific examples and evidence of the individual's contributions, achievements, and impact on the AFL Barwon community must be provided.

Review by the History & Awards Sub-Committee:

- Once submitted, the application will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.
- The H&ASC will assess the merits of the application, considering the individual's legacy, contributions to the sport, and influence within the community.
- The H&ASC may at their discretion request further information from the nominee pertaining to the application, to ensure every application is reviewed impartially.

Approval Process:

- If the application meets the required criteria and is approved by the H&ASC, the renaming of the award will be presented to AFL Barwon Commission for approval.
- The AFL Barwon Commission's decision will be communicated to the applicant, and appropriate steps will be taken to implement the name change.
- The recipient of the award renaming will be advised (If applicable) if successful to ensure that there is complete transparency including right of refusal.

This process ensures that all award names in the AFL Barwon region honour those who have made significant, lasting contributions to our community, preserving their legacies for future generations.

NUMBER 1 TICKET HOLDERS

Bellarine Football Netball League & Geelong Football Netball League

The Number 1 Ticket Holder is a prestigious honour that is bestowed upon an individual who exemplifies outstanding support, dedication, and passion for their respective league.

This role is often reserved for a person of high standing within the community, someone who has made significant contributions to their league or has a strong connection to their club.

Criteria for Nomination

- Service to the League over an extensive period of time, and/or
- Service to the affiliated Club over an extensive period of time, and/or,
- A person who provides significant material support to the Club/League and/or who has very high standing or profile in the community which would bring interest and prestige.

Nomination Process

The selection of the Number 1 ticket holder for each League/Sport will be determined by the History & Awards Sub Committee on an annual basis. The below process must be followed:

Submission of Application:

- Interested parties must submit a detailed application on the form link found [here](#)
- The application should include comprehensive information about the individual proposed.
- Specific examples and evidence of the individual's contributions, achievements, and impact on the AFL Barwon community must be provided.

Review by the History & Awards Sub-Committee:

- Once submitted, the application will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.
- The H&ASC will assess the merits of the application, considering the individual's legacy, contributions to the sport, and influence within the community.
- The H&ASC may at their discretion request further information from the nominee pertaining to the application, to ensure every application is reviewed impartially.

NUMBER 1 TICKET HOLDERS

Approval Process:

- If the application meets the required criteria and receives approval from the H&ASC, the renaming of the award will be presented to AFL Barwon Commission for their approval.
- The AFL Barwon Commission's decision will be communicated to the applicant, and relevant League Board.
- The recipient of the Number 1 ticket holder will be advised if successful, to ensure that there is complete transparency including right of refusal.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

- Each Number 1 Ticket Holder will be presented to a 'Football' and 'Netball' person at the AFL Barwon community awards each year.
- Number 1 Ticket Holders will be in place for 12 months from the date of the Community Awards and receive the following entitlements:
 - Official Number One Seasons Pass (and a guest pass) of the League
 - Invitations for the Number 1 Ticket Holder and a guest to attend all official AFL Barwon and League events through the season.
 - Grand Final official 'tossler' of the coin prior to the commencement of the League Football/Netball matches.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP & SERVICE AWARDS

AFL Barwon Life Membership

AFL Barwon may at its discretion annually elect as AFL Barwon Life Members any person/s who has/have rendered outstanding service to the Commission.

Criteria for Nomination

The criteria for nomination for AFL Barwon Life Membership are that the nominee must have:

- served as an AFL Barwon Commissioner with a minimum 10 years' service or
- given outstanding service to AFL Barwon for a minimum total period of 15 years or
- acted as Chairperson of the Independent Tribunal serving for 10 continuous years or
- held a role appointed or ratified by the Commission
- and offered the service voluntarily

Nomination Process

Nominations for AFL Barwon Life Membership will be determined by the History & Awards Sub Committee on an annual basis. The below process must be followed:

Submission of Application:

- Nominations for AFL Barwon Life Membership must be submitted on the application form that can be found [here](#).
- The application should include comprehensive information about the individual proposed and outline the criteria met to be eligible for the service award.

Review by the History & Awards Sub-Committee:

- Once submitted, the application will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.
- The H&ASC will assess the merits of the application, considering the criteria to be eligible for a Life Membership.
- The H&ASC may at their discretion request further information from the nominee pertaining to the application, to ensure every application is reviewed impartially.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP & SERVICE AWARDS

Approval Process:

- If the application meets the required criteria and receives approval from the H&ASC, the award will be presented to AFL Barwon Commission for their approval.
- The AFL Barwon Commission's decision will be communicated to the applicant.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the Annual Community Awards Presentation event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

AFL Barwon Service Awards

AFL Barwon may at its discretion annually award AFL Barwon Service Awards to any person/s who has/have rendered outstanding service.

Criteria for Nomination

The criteria for nomination for AFL Barwon Service Awards are that the nominee must have:

- acted as a Club personnel with 15 years or more continuous service with their Club or
- provided 10 years continuous service to AFL Barwon or
- provided service where a remuneration was provided from AFL Barwon or
- provided 10 years continuous service in non-chairperson positions (ie: Tribunal Member) or
- been a player with 300 games at senior level for football or netball at an affiliated AFL Barwon Club.

Nomination Process

Nominations for AFL Barwon Service Awards will be determined by the History & Awards Sub Committee on an annual basis. The below process must be followed:

Submission of Application:

- Nominations for AFL Barwon Service Awards must be submitted on the application form that can be found [here](#).
- The application should include comprehensive information about the individual proposed and outline the criteria met to be eligible for the service award.

Review by the History & Awards Sub-Committee:

- Once submitted, the application will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.
- The H&ASC will assess the merits of the application, considering the criteria to be eligible for a Service Award.
- The H&ASC may at their discretion request further information from the nominee pertaining to the application, to ensure every application is reviewed impartially.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP & SERVICE AWARDS

Approval Process:

- If the application meets the required criteria and receives approval from the H&ASC, the award will be presented to AFL Barwon Commission for their approval.
- The AFL Barwon Commission's decision will be communicated to the applicant or applicants affiliated club.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the Annual Community Awards Presentation event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

Bellarine FNL & GFNL Life Membership

The Bellarine FNL and Geelong FNL may annually elect Life Members to the respective leagues.

Criteria for Nomination

The criteria for nomination for Geelong FNL or Bellarine FNL Life Membership are that the nominee must have:

- held the position of Football Club President, Secretary or Treasurer with 10 years accumulated service in any of the three roles. This would also include service for a continuous period in a combination of any of the three positions or
- provided 15 years continuous service directly for either league or
- held the position of chairperson of Netball section of a Club serving for 10 continuous years
- and offered the service voluntarily

Nomination Process

Nominations for Life Membership or AFL Barwon Service Awards must be forwarded to the RGM no later than 28 days prior to the Annual General Meeting on the appropriate nomination form.

Financial Members or Affiliate Clubs may nominate persons for Life Membership on a nomination form and in the manner approved by the Commission. Life Memberships for Club individuals for the Bellarine FNL and Geelong FNL must be on a club letterhead.

- The person nominated does not have to be a member of the Association.
- Each nomination form must be signed by the nominator and be seconded.
- Both the nominator and the seconder must be financial Members of the Association at the time of the nomination.
- Details of the service of the nominee must be supplied on the nomination form with any appropriate support documents
- The relevant League Board or Commission will accept nominations and determine those nominees who meet the published criteria for the Award of Life Membership to be awarded Life Membership of the Association for recommendation to the Annual General Meeting

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the Annual General Meeting of the specific League in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

PRESENTATION NIGHT AWARDS

Rookie of the Year Award - Football

The Rookie of the Year Award celebrates the exceptional talent and promise of young Footballers within the Bellarine & Geelong Football Netball Leagues. The aim of this award is to recognise our future champions and to promote their achievements.

This prestigious accolade is awarded to a standout player who is under 21 years of age as of January 1 of each calendar year.

Criteria for Nomination

- These players must be under 21 years of age as of the 1st of January of that calendar year.
- They must have played no more than 10 Senior Football games prior to the commencement of the current season.
- All nominations must be accompanied by text describing the achievements of the nominated players and the reason they have been nominated, along with a photo.

Selection Process

This award will be chosen by a selection panel consisting of members from the Football Operations department.

The selected award winner will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the relevant League's Presentation Awards event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

PRESENTATION NIGHT AWARDS

Rising Star Award - Netball

The Rising Star Award celebrates the exceptional talent and promise of young netballers within the Bellarine & Geelong Football Netball Leagues. The aim of this award is to recognise our future champions and to promote their achievements.

This prestigious accolade is awarded to a standout player who is under 21 years of age as of January 1 of each calendar year.

Criteria for Nomination

- All clubs can nominate a maximum of 2 players from their club that meet the criteria of a “rising star”.
- These players must be under 21 years of age as of the 1st of January of that calendar year.
- They must have played no more than 10 A Grade netball games prior to the commencement of the current season.
- All nominations must be accompanied by text describing the achievements of the nominated players and the reason they have been nominated, along with a photo.

Selection Process

This award will be chosen by a selection panel consisting of members from the Netball Operations department.

The selected award winner will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the relevant League's Presentation Awards event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

PRESENTATION NIGHT AWARDS

Coaches Team of the Year - Football

The AFL Barwon Coaches Team of the Year for Football Award recognises the outstanding efforts and achievements of players that has displayed exceptional performance, teamwork, and sportsmanship throughout the season. Selected by the Senior Football coaches from across the league, this prestigious award highlights the best individuals in their position in their respective league.

Criteria for Nominations

- Each Club's Senior coach(es) are to submit the nominations for this award based off the top 40 players from Coaches Player of the Year Award.
- Coaches are required to select selecting 7 forwards, 9 midfielders and 7 defenders.
- There can only one entry submitted per club.
- Senior Coaches are able to nominate players from their own club.

Selection Process

This award will be chosen by a selection panel consisting of members from the Football Operations department. The coaches votes are tallied with the highest voted players in their positions, selected in the team.

The selected award winner will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the relevant League's Presentation Awards event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

Coaches Team of the Year - Netball

The AFL Barwon Coaches Team of the Year for Netball Award recognises the outstanding efforts and achievements of players that has displayed exceptional performance, teamwork, and sportsmanship throughout the season. Selected by the A-Grade coaches from across the league, this prestigious award highlights the best individuals in their position in their respective league.

Criteria for Nominations

- Each Club's A-Grade coach(es) are to submit the nominations for this award, selecting 3 goalers, 3 mid court players, and 3 defenders.
- There can only one entry submitted per club.
- A-Grade Coaches are unable to nominate players from their own club.

Selection Process

This award will be chosen by a selection panel consisting of members from the Netball Operations department. The coaches votes are tallied with the highest voted players in their positions, selected in the team.

The selected award winner will be reviewed by the History and Awards Sub-Committee.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the relevant League's Presentation Awards event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

PRESENTATION NIGHT AWARDS

Coaches Player of the Year

The Coaches Player of the Year is an award voted by each Senior coach on a 5,4,3,2,1 basis after each home and away game, acknowledging outstanding effort by an individual player in a season.

There are individual awards for the Bellarine FNL Seniors and A-Grade, Geelong FNL Seniors & A-Grade, and the Division 1 Senior Female Football competitions.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

These awards will be presented at the relevant League's Presentation Awards event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

Most Valuable Player

The Most Valuable Player is an annual award chosen by the players, in order to crown the MVP in the Geelong Football Netball League.

Selection Process

The voting procedure for the award is each player who played in the Senior Geelong FNL Competition each year awards ONE vote to the player they believe is the best in the league.

The leading vote-getter receives the award which is presented at the League's Presentation Awards event.

Award Presentations and Entitlements

This award will be presented at the relevant League's Presentation Awards event in which this date will be set each year by the AFL Barwon Commission.

Criteria for Nomination

- Coaches a Netball team in the 15&Under, 17&Under or 19&Under midweek or Saturday AFL Barwon competitions.
- Outstanding coaching of youth netball teams.
- Focus on player development and skill enhancement.
- Promotion of sportsmanship and teamwork among young players.
- Contribution to the growth of youth netball in the club and community.

Selection Process

This award will be chosen by a selection panel consisting of members of the History and Awards Sub-Committee as outlined on page 4.

Coach of the Year Awards

Junior Football Coach of the Year

Net Set Go Coach of the Year

The Net Set Go Coach of the Year award celebrates exceptional coaching within the AFL Barwon community. This prestigious accolade is awarded to a coach who has demonstrated outstanding dedication, skill, and passion in nurturing young netball talent through the Net Set Go program. Selection Process

Administrator of the Year Awards

John Edsall Award (Outstanding Service to Administration)
